

Jesuit High School Class of 2014 Highlights

Total Number of Seniors: 270

Testing and GPA for 2014

- Average ACT: 25.6 (CA 22.2; National 20.9)
- Average SAT (2400 Scale): 1725 (CA 1505; National 1498)
- Average GPA (Based on 7 semesters): 3.521

In the class of 2014, 270 students completed and submitted 1936 applications for 249 colleges in the United States and Europe. This is an average of 7.2 applications per student. Of those, over 200 colleges made offers of admission to our students.

College Matriculation (as of May 7, 2014 with 251 students reporting)

- 94% plan to attend a 4 year college or university
- 5.6% plan to attend a 2 year community public/private college
- .4% have not yet decided where they will attend school

Of those students with current plans:

57% will attend a public institution (*52% in 2013, 43% in 2012, 50% in 2011*) 38% will attend a private institution (*35% in 2013, 45% in 2012, 39% in 2011*) 27% will attend a Catholic institution (*24% in 2013, 29% in 2012, 31% in 2011*) 19% will attend a Jesuit institution (*16% in 2013, 22% in 2012, 21% in 2011*)

Jesuit institutions graduates will attend: Boston College, Creighton University, Fordham University, Georgetown University, Gonzaga University, Marquette University, Loyola Marymount University, Santa Clara University, Saint Louis University, Seattle University, University of San Francisco.

The Class of 2014 was accepted to 19 of the 28 Jesuit universities in the United States.

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Advanced Placement

531 exams were ordered for 287 students (10th, 11th, and 12th grades) who planned to take AP exams. In the current senior class, 10 students were granted **AP Scholar** recognition, 16 students were awarded **AP Scholar with Honors** and 3 students were designated as an **AP Scholar with Distinction**.

National Merit Program

In the last five years, 12 members of the Classes of 2010-2014 were named National Merit Semi-Finalists and 60 seniors were named Commended Students. The National Hispanic Scholar Recognition Program recognized 16 Jesuit students, and three students were named African-American National Achievement Scholars.

College Search and Preparation Related Efforts

We are fortunate to host visits from college admission representatives on our campus. Typically more than 50 different colleges and universities visit Jesuit High School each year. Often the admission representative visiting our campus is the same person who will be reviewing the students' applications and recommending them for admission to the college or university. Rep visits are a great opportunity for students to learn more about the programs and opportunities available at different schools as well as make a connection with the admission representative.

In addition, Jesuit offers evening events for students and parents to help understand the college admissions process. The Jesuit College Fair, College Fair for Private and Parochial Schools, College Info Night, and the class specific Meet the Counselor Night all provide an opportunity for parents to ask questions and get information to help guide their student through the college admissions process.

Counselors work with students to determine their best options. Students can compare colleges and universities, explore scholarship opportunities and track the status of transcripts and letters of recommendation using Naviance.
