You did not really have to be Einstein to predict a Jesuit v Burbank clash for the State Championship on Saturday and that is the way it all panned out.

Both the Sac Valley teams had dominating wins over their opponents from the Bay Area to qualify - Jesuit beat Los Altos from San Jose 41-0 while Burbank beat Lamorinda 46-3 in the semi-finals.

The victory showed the value of the recently completed Seattle/Canada tour with the Jesuit team match-fit and ready to fire.

Los Altos came to play but made some early errors and paid dearly for these mistakes. A couple of early penalties took Jesuit to the Los Altos try line where another quickly taken penalty saw powerhouse lock John Faletoese charge over from the tap move.

Adam Collins conversion was true and Jesuit led 7-0 after six minutes of play. Jesuit continued to apply the pressure and it was the "Captain Carnage" Louie Stanfill who scored next again from a quickly taken tap kick.

Jesuit had Los Altos on the back foot for much of the first half and some excellent interchange passing saw center Zack Powell crash over for a try and a 17-0 lead after only 18 minutes of play.

The determination and speed of flanker Pat Ramos paid dividends when he chased a clever chip ahead and won the 30 meter race to the ball lying in in-goal for the try that was converted by Adam Collins.

Stanfill closed out the scoring for the first half with his second try and a 29-0 lead for the Marauders at the break.

Jesuit rang the changes in the second half and the result was a disjointed twenty minutes of play with no points being scored and few patches of exciting Rugby being played.

The changes in the front row had some effect when Jesuit won two tight heads in succession. From the second Stanfill powered his way over for his third try and a 34-0 lead.

It was a case of best till last when Delorian Walton scored the try of the game. Given little room to move on the left wing, he weaved, squirmed and stepped his way past at least five defenders before outpacing the defense to score beside the posts.

Adam Collins took the score to 41-0 with his successful conversion and the almost annual meeting with Burbank to decide who goes to Dallas for the Nationals 16-17 May.

Los Altos voted Adam Collins and Captain Carnage as best back and best forward. Flankers Robbie Chappell and Pat Ramos deserve special mentions for huge amounts of constructive work done while Ryan Taylor in his first game at full back with the Varsity XV showed talent and a cool head under pressure.
