Athletic Eligibility & Academic Probation

- A student is placed on Academic Probation when his GPA is below 2.0.
- If a student has 2 consecutive grading periods (i.e. 1st Quarter and then 1st Semester) then, he is INELIGIBLE to play a sport during the following grading period; aligned to the CIF rules.
- \succ There are no waivers for eligibility extensions.
- Students will need to attend teacher office hours weekly and have regular check ins with their counselor during distance learning.

Successful Study Habits

- Calendar: Map It Out (semester, weekly, daily)
- > Space: This is "My Spot to Study"
- Prioritize: What is most difficult...first!
- \succ Blocks: (40-50 minutes per is ideal).
- Prominence: School is #1! Grades = Paycheck
- Resources: Tutors, sites, smart friends/study groups.
- Flexibility: "Great _____ adjust!" (students, stock brokers, artists, doctors, etc.)



"Studying" vs. "Doing Assignments"

- > They are not the same thing...Jesuit students must do BOTH!
- JHS recommends a minimum of 30 minutes of intentional time per class, per day.
- Repetition, consistency and regularity are the most important elements to any learning plan. It's About Time!
- ➤ "A dime of focus is better than a dollar of daydreaming..."






