#### **Counseling at Jesuit High School**

- Counselors are here to support our students academically, socially, emotionally, and guide them through their college search and application process.

### **Athletic Eligibility & Academic Probation**

- A student is placed on Academic Probation when his GPA is below 2.0.
- If a student has 2 consecutive grading periods (i.e. 1st Quarter and then 1st Semester) then, he is INELIGIBLE to play a sport during the following grading period; aligned to the CIF rules.
- $\succ$  There are no waivers for eligibility extensions.
- Students will need to attend teacher office hours weekly and have regular check ins with their counselor while on probation.

- Focus on your strengths
- Be present and engaged with class and teacher
- Keep a Growth Mindset!


#### Time Management & Organization

- Use a calendar
- Establish a study space at home
- 30 minutes of intentional time per class, per day.
- Work 40-50 minutes at a time. Take short breaks.
- Keep track of grades in Powerschool and assignments and due dates in Google Classroom
- Check your email every day!



#### Use Your Resources

- Utilize teacher office hours
- Visit the peer tutors in the library
- Form a study group with classmates
- Get to know your counselor and the Wellness Center!





#### Ways to Learn & Study

- Vanderbilt University's Center For Teaching states "learning style is widely used to describe how learners gather, sift through, interpret, organize, come to conclusions about, and "store" information for further use."
- V.A.R.K. is a popular system that highlights 4 types of learning modalities. Visual, Auditory, Read/Write, Kinesthetic
- Caution: Beware of identifying with just one style. It is important to think about these modalities as an option to approach your learning. Some modalities may benefit you in certain subjects more than others!



- If there are questions the student can see his counselor and/or teacher.

### Things to Remember continued...

- Students will receive a preliminary list of courses and have the ability to <u>appeal placements</u>; dates TBD
- Check the Jesuit website for Summer School registration and schedule dates; Jesuit students have priority registration until May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Any summer school courses NOT taken at Jesuit must be approved by Mr. O'Connor, Assistant Principal for Academics.




