Collaboration Periods

- Most Wednesdays begin with a Collaboration Period which runs from 8:15am to 9:30am. In this case, first class begins at 9:45am. In the spring, there are a couple of afternoon collaboration periods that will begin at 1:35pm.
- Students are required to attend all Collaboration Periods scheduled for their year level. If a student will be absent from a Collaboration Period, all of the school's normal attendance policies apply.
- If a student's year level is not involved in a particular date's Collaboration Period, he can arrive before the day's first class period (9:45am), schedule personal off campus appointments, or use defined areas of campus (e.g. Harris Center and the King Library).

<p>If a student's year-level is scheduled for a Collaboration Period meeting on a given day, his presence is <u>mandatory</u> and attendance will be taken. If a student will be absent from a required Collaboration Period, all of the school's normal attendance policies apply.</p> <p>Students <u>not</u> scheduled for a Collaboration Period meeting on a given day are welcome to do any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sleep in and arrive in time for the first class period of the day (9:45 a.m.) • Use the following areas of campus: Harris Center, King Library, student quads • Schedule personal off-campus appointments. Families are strongly encouraged to schedule all appointments (e.g. doctor, dentist, etc.) during open Collaboration Periods. • On days listed with (HR), students must report to their Homeroom by 8:15 a.m. • Counseling groups are divided into A and B groups. Students have received an email noting which group they are in. 			

Dress Code

- Students must wear a collared JHS-authorized logowear shirt to school each day.
- Sweatshirts and outwear may also be worn so long as they are JHS-authorized logowear. This also means any collared shirts, sweatshirts or polos from other Jesuit activities are allowed.
- A non-authorized coat/jacket is allowed, but when it is removed, the student must be wearing a JHS-authorized collared shirt.
- Shorts and pants – chino-style slacks of any solid color are allowed. No cargo-style, patterned, sweats, pajamas or denim are allowed.
- Marauders Cove will be open this evening for you to make purchases.

PowerSchool

- The primary purpose of the PowerSchool Grading portal is to provide you and your son with timely and accurate information regarding academic performance and completion of assignments, assessments, and projects. Both students and parents should check the PowerSchool Grading portal weekly to monitor student progress.
- Parents will access quarter and semester grades via the PowerSchool Portal.
- Available with an internet connection or by mobile app
- Parents will receive login and registration information via email at the beginning of the school year.
- Students will receive their login information at orientation.

Google Classroom

- The primary source of course information is Google Classroom. Only students have access to Google Classroom as this is where course information and assignments are posted.
- If a parent/guardian observes that work is marked as missing in PowerSchool it is appropriate to ask the student to open up Google Classroom to determine the nature and scope of non-completed work.
- Parents do not have direct access to Google Classroom.

Attendance Information

If your son is absent:

- **Call** the attendance line by 9:00am to report the absence (916-480-2135) **AND**
- Send a signed **note** with your son to the Dean's Office **before school** starts the day he returns to school

If your son needs to leave early for a doctor's appointment:

- Send a signed **note** with your son to the Dean's Office **before school** starts stating what time he needs to be released from class

BYOD Technology Basics

- Recharging – Students are expected to bring their device every day to school fully charged. Students should not expect to charge their devices on campus.

Textbook Basics

- Many of our required readings are in electronic format and will be accessed through the students device. However, not all the publishers use a format compatible with devices so not all books are available electronically at this time. Until there are more ebooks available that fit our needs, we will be using a combination of ebooks and traditional books for our classes.
- All the **ibook** titles listed have a link to the correct book as they do not have unique ISBN numbers.
- The 13-digit ISBN number provided on the list should be used to locate and purchase a traditional book. **You must verify the ISBN number when purchasing books....it is the only way you can be assured of getting the correct book.**

Textbook Basics

- In order to help understand the ebook market, we have provided the following definitions of the terms most often used when referring to digital books:

Term	Description
EPUB	EPUB is a file format for ebooks, used by many ebook readers and the iPad.
Ebook	A shortened version of the term electronic book, now often used to describe any digital book.
Web access ebook	Students purchase an access code from the provider and redeem it at the provider's website (i.e. CourseSmart or Pearson). Access to the book is then available to the student for a pre-determined length of time via the web access portal or iPad app. Depending on the title, students have access to the book for 180 to 360 days from the date of initial access. This is different than an iBook and not accessible from the iBookstore.
iBook	iBook is the proprietary file format used by Apple for their digital books sold in the iBookstore or created using the iBooks Author application. iBooks, once purchased, are generally available to the student permanently.
Traditional books	Traditional books are those that come in a paper format, whether it be hardcover or paperback.

The Textbook List

- The textbook list is located at www.jesuithighschool.org
- The list is broken down by operating system: iOS or Windows/Chrome.
- Books are listed by grade level then Department. Use your son's schedule to determine the books needed.
- Web Access books should be ordered **no later than July 19** to ensure that they will arrive on time. Most publishers do not email the access code; the codes are usually sent via regular mail. This process can take 3-4 weeks.
- Some publishers will send the access code directly to Jesuit. These books are identified on the booklist and will be distributed directly to the students the first full week of school.

The Textbook List

- Students and families will have the option of a traditional book or an ebook, if available.
- To ensure that your book order arrives on time, please check the processing and shipping information provided by the book seller. Processing time does not include shipping time and **can add a minimum of 5-7 business days** to your order.
- Students and parents should take into consideration the potential for schedule changes before purchasing any books.
- Regardless of where you choose to purchase your books, it is the student's responsibility to have his textbooks by the first day of class each semester.
